Erythropoiesis stimulants	Blood pressure, iron, ferritin, complete blood count
Fibrates	Liver function, complete blood count
Iron	Iron, ferritin, complete blood count
Lithium	Drug level
Niacin	Blood glucose, liver function
Statins	Liver function
Theophylline	Drug level
Thyroid hormone replacement	Thyroid function
Warfarin	Prothrombin time, international normalized ratio
