We are asking you to take part in a research study. The purpose of this protocol is to collect quality improvement survey data from multiple sclerosis health care providers (HCP) regarding practice models, preferred training and resources for promoting exercise in comprehensive MS care. You will be asked to complete a questionnaire containing scaled measure and openended questions regarding your personal opinions about the clarity and relatability of practice models for promoting exercise to persons with MS, our preferred training method, and additional resources you require to promote exercise to persons with MS in a comprehensive MS care setting. This study will initially enroll 20 health care providers before opening the survey to health care providers nationwide.
