## Teaching

- Student teaching evaluations with written comments
- Peer teaching evaluation(s)
- Evidence of any course development activity
  - Syllabus for new course developed
  - Description of this activity in personal statement
  - Email trail related to this activity (e.g., email with Associate Dean, program director related to development/approval of course)
- Student advisement/mentor activities (this can be noted in personal statement with reference to listing of this activity on the CV
  - List of students for whom faculty is a chairperson or member of Capstone or Dissertation Committees. Listing on CV or document submitted should include students' names and title of Capstone of Dissertation
  - List of honors students for whom faculty has mentored and title of honors project

## Scholarship

- Faculty practice
- Clinical practice
  - Letter from employer that confirms employment and attests to impact faculty member has had in the agency
- Research initiatives/collaboration
  - Articles published or in press since your last review not cumulative
    - do not include copies of manuscripts in development
  - Book proposals (accepted or in the pipeline)
  - Funded grant award letters / letter of non-award
  - Programs of conferences/workshops/events you organized
  - Letters of appointment to leadership positions in relevant associations
  - Requests to keynote a conference or guest lecture for a course
  - Articles/news segments in which you were featured as an expert
  - Notification of awards related to scholarship (e.g., professional organization manuscript/abstract award; professional organization researcher of the year award, etc.)

## Service

- Letters from officers/leaders in professional organizations attesting to faculty member's leadership service to the agency and its impact
- Service award notification letter(s)
- Documentation of role as faculty mentor (e.g., email notification of appointment as faculty mentor)
