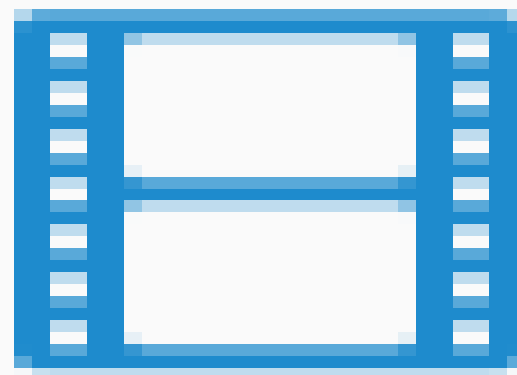

A 60-Year-Old Man with abdominal Unpleasant Sensations

Vignette

- His medical history was unremarkable except for benign prostatic hyperplasia.
- Unpleasant sensations occurred in abdomen after lying down for rest.
- Unpleasant sensations were partially improved by rubbing or slapping abdomen (video).
- Unpleasant sensations were worse in the evening than during the day.
- Gastrointestinal endoscopy and abdominal computed tomography were normal.



Restless Abdomen

- A rare variant of restless legs syndrome (RLS), restless abdomen, was considered for the patient.
- Most patients with RLS or Restless Abdomen have a good response to dopaminergic treatment.^{1,2}
- Periodic limb movements was one of supporting features for the diagnosis of RLS/Restless Abdomen.
