- · Programs are not required to offer an interview to applicants who have signaled
- Applicants have been instructed not to signal their home institution or any programs at which
 they have completed a clinical subinternship in the current calendar year. Programs should
 not expect to receive a signal from applicants in these scenarios.

- · Program Signaling Code of Conduct
 - · Programs shall NOT disclose identification of applicants who have signaled.
