REVIEWER COMMENTS:

Reviewer #1:

Most of the information included in the manuscript is rather well known to professionals who have followed the unfolding events surrounding the COVID-19 global pandemic, a now almost three-year worldwide medical nightmare, which has led to the death of millions, and likely impaired the health of many others. In my assessment, most Obstetrician Gynecologists are already aware of the content of this effort.

Furthermore, worldwide governing bodies (such as ACOG and SMFM in the USA and many others abroad) have summarized and issued readily available guidelines regarding COVID-19 vaccination in pregnancy for those individual physicians who have not closely followed the development of, efficacy, and safety of mRNA COVID-19 vaccination during

pregnancy.

Notwithstanding, this comprehensive manuscript is well-written, informative and addresses pertinent points relating to the topic of COVID-19 mRNA vaccine prevention among pregnant individuals, examining both maternal and fetal/neonatal aspects.

I have studied the manuscript in detail, and do not find glaring/gross errors or outstanding inaccuracies. As such, this submission might potentially be viewed favorably as a source of current data mainly targeting physicians who have not followed every detail of these topics as most MFM physicians and I imagine Obstetricians in general, have.

Reviewer #2:

In this narrative review, the authors summarize some of the available evidence surrounding COVID-19 vaccination in the form of question/response. These questions are commonly asked questions by patients and the authors craft responses to these questions with a summary of the recent literature. The narrative is well-written and easy to follow. The questions are salient to the general population.

My main concern is that this narrative in this journal format does not meet its intended audience. The journal readership who may read ACOG practice bulletins is familiar with this information and therefore this review does not present anything new or novel. It would be better served toward the population, however, the general population does not in general read medical literature. As a result, this narrative, which similar narratives and reviews have been recently published, is not novel.


