

For this treatment question, function and awareness of your knee are shown differently.

With function, you are shown a chance of being able to do all daily activities. Remember, your ability to do all daily activities means that you will be able to stand for an unlimited amount of time, climb stairs at a regular speed, and do low-impact sports like walking, swimming, and biking.

Almost Never Aware: You think about your knee replacement once a month.

Seldom Aware: You think about your knee replacement <u>once a week</u>.

If Operation A and Operation B shown below were the only options available, which would you choose?
