Supplemental methods section

1- Process used for the mapping of prostitution sites and sex workers in Benin conducted by NACP at the end of 2011.

The mapping is the initial step prior to the Integrated Biological and Behavioural Survey (IBBS) of the HIV epidemic which is conducted every two years by the National AIDS control program. It is to map prostitution sites and collect detailed data allowing to estimate the sex worker population size as well as their typology. It consists of:

- Locating and identifying all sites of prostitution in Benin; and
- Identifying all types of sex workers (SW) (official or professional and clandestine), including waitresses and bar staff.

Methodological approach and definition of variables

This is a cross-sectional study, which took place from 27 October to 6 November 2011, covering all sites of prostitution and SWs throughout the national territory. All existing prostitution sites in 77 municipalities, in both urban and rural areas, were systematically identified and listed by investigators, with the help of guides and key informants. There are many types of prostitution sites and places where paid sexual services are negotiated and/or occur. These are brothels, hotels, motels, hostels, public squares, streets, etc. where SWs are selling sex in exchange for money. SWs are defined as women receiving money or presents in exchange for sex.

Method and instruments for collecting data

Sites were identified through semi-structured interviews with key informants (guides, bartenders, hotel managers, leaders/managers of sites, etc). A data file was created to include a record of basic features of each site (mainly type) and its members (main demographic characteristics such as age and nationality). Each locality (district) is

ranked, village by village and district by district. The door to door process involved enabled the investigator to identify the sites and become familiar with the responsible people or required resources. The instrument employed was the census form mapping sites of prostitution which has three main components: identification data for each site, site location data, and descriptive data of the site, including the estimated number of SWs. The methodological mapping aimed to provide a representative picture of the situation of SWs in Benin.

2- Questionnaire development measuring psychological variables

The questionnaire was developed in accordance with the methodology recommended by Ajzen, ²⁷ applying the approach described by Gagné & Godin. ²⁸ The behaviour under study was defined in terms of action (performance), target (HIV testing), context (in an appropriate health service: SA), and time (in the next three months). A qualitative study was first conducted in order to determine salient beliefs regarding FSWs' examined behaviour. Individual semi-structured interviews were conducted with 66 FSWs. Open questions made it possible to identify the perceived advantages and disadvantages of being HIV tested in the next three months, and the significant persons who would approve or disapprove of this behaviour, as well as the perceived barriers and facilitators to this behaviour. Qualitative analysis of interview content was carried out by one author (GB) and validated by another (MPG). The information gathered was used to develop the questionnaire. ¹⁰ We performed test-retest validation of the questionnaire among 30 FSWs from the population studied. The questionnaire was administered twice within an interval of two weeks.

Testing carried out in the context of an investigation of disease monitoring, where results are not given to participants, is excluded.



Interviewer: Explain and present the visual scale to the participant so she can see and or indicate with a cross or a line the responses on the scale for each item.








c) How would you evaluate the chances that you would be tested for HIV at a STI clinic dedicated to sex workers (SA) during the next three (3) months?








NORMATIVE BELIEFS (NB)







a) "When you are a sex worker, it is necessary to be tested for HIV at a STI clinic dedicated to sex workers (SA) every three (3) months"






DESCRIPTIVE NORMS (DN)

"Being tested for HIV at a STI clinic dedicated to sex workers (SA) every three months is a normal routine that many female sex workers adopt."




PERCEIVED BEHAVIORAL CONTROL (PCB)
